01 PORTFOLIO DIRECTOR SUMMARY

During the quarter we saw significant progress in the delivery of the Growth Deal projects, with a number of business cases approved by the Economic Ambition Board:

- Outline Business Case for the Cydnerth project;
- Outline Business Case for the Advanced Wireless project;
- Business Justification Case for the Centre for Environmental Biotechnology project;
- Business Justification Case for the LPWAN project;
- Full Business Case for the Tourism Talent Network project.

This sees the Centre for Environmental Biotechnology, LPWAN and Tourism Talent Network now mobilizing for delivery with arrangements ongoing for preparing to sign the Funding Agreements.

During the quarter we re-launched the tender for the Smart Local Energy Fund Advisor on Sell2Wales, significant interest was shown in the opportunity. The closing date for applications is in early October, where work to evaluate and appoint will start.

The Section 106 agreement for Former North Wales Hospital project was agreed by Denbighshire County Council planning committee in July subject to complying with pre commencement planning conditions.

Ambition North Wales are working in collaboration with Growing Mid Wales, to define priority locations across the regions which require improvements to 4G technology. Working in collaboration across regions in order to get the best outcome for our residents and ensure value for money. This request is the first phase for the Connected Key Sites and Corridors 4G project which aims to improve the availability of mobile voice and data services and full-fibre broadband services to key commercial sites across the region.

With the deadline for delivery of the Shared Prosperity Funded workstreams emerging during the next quarter, we are making great progress. Work is drawing to a close on supporting the region's local authorities to adopt asset agreements which will support the 4G project delivery. Great progress has been made on our Shared Prosperity Funded workstreams: 18 out of 20 SME's have received support to investigate options for adoption of advanced wireless technologies. The Smart Local Energy bid writing support has now closed for applications, a total of 17 organisations are currently being supported by our framework of providers.

Portfolio Business Case		Work has been ongoing to update the Portfolio Business Case 2024, the update will be presented to the Economic Ambition Board for approval in November and subsequently submitted to Welsh Government and UK Government as part of the annual award of funding process.
Delivery Pipeline		The delivery pipeline is consistent with the 2023 Portfolio Business Case, with projects reporting against this timetable currently. The pipeline will be reviewed and updated as part of the 2024 Portfolio Business Case.
Governance		The Portfolio, Programme and Project Management Framework is now well established with the Portfolio Board and five Programme Boards operating effectively. A Conflicts of Interest procedure is in place across all Boards.
Assurance		The fourth annual Growth Deal assurance review (Programme Assurance Review) was completed in October 2023 with the report delivering an 'Amber-Red' confidence rating for the portfolio. A follow up Assurance of Action Plan (AAP) review took place in December 2023, with the report delivering an Amber Green confidence rating. The next review has been arranged for October 2024. The PMO commissioned an independent review of Governance and Assurance, a report consisting of 8 recommendations was received, the PMO are currently working through the recommendations.
Resource and Capacity		The Growth Deal Programme Manager left her role at the end of August, her replacement will commence in post on the 14 th of October 2024. Following approval by the Economic Ambition Board in March, fixed term contracts (not including staff funded by LEAP or SPF) have been extended to March 2026, reducing the risk of staff leaving in the short term.
Finance		A total of £6.34m Growth Deal funding has been spent to date. This included £2.15m on the Digital Signal Processing Centre, £2.75m on the Enterprise Engineering & Optics Centre and £1.44m to fund the revenue expenditure.
Investment		Securing the public and private sector investment required to deliver the Growth Deal remains a significant risk across the portfolio. The Economic Ambition Board approved the Investment Strategy during their meeting in March 2024.
Risk		Overall risk profile remains consistent with Quarter 1. Procurement of the support services framework (2023 PAR recommendation) is underway and due to complete in Nov 2024. A number of high residual risks remain which are being managed by the PMO including affordability, consenting, delay and investment.
Benefits Monitoring & Evaluation		Trainings have been held with Ambition North Wales and Project Sponsors in how to use the Benefits Reporting platform developed over the past year. Projects have all uploaded their indicators, and will start populating the platform over the coming weeks enabling the project, programme and portfolio teams to track progress towards spending objectives and benefits.
Emissions and Biodiversity		Phase 2 of the Emissions and Biodiversity Project has been launched in partnership with the Welsh Local Government Association (WLGA) with the aims of (1) streamlining the approach in line with local authority business case processes and (2) training over 75 project managers and decision-makers across Wales how to use the approach. A draft of the streamlined methodology is currently being reviewed by the PMO.
Communication and Engagement		Press releases on the approval of three business cases including Former North Wales Hospital, Centre for Environmental Biotechnology and LPWAN projects, along with press releases on three of the SPF funded workstreams were issued. Our social media channels covered promotion of tender opportunities, as well as details of our business survey focusing on social value. Our engagement and reach continued to grow on social media, with over 8,500 active website users.

- Western Gateway, Wrexham Wrexham County Borough Council have appointed WSP to undertake a Welsh Transport Appraisal Guidance (WelTAG) Lite assessment. WSP have commenced collating baseline evidence and agreeing assumptions that can be used in their assessment model.
- Former North Wales Hospital, Denbigh The S106 agreement was agreed by Denbighshire County Council planning committee in July subject to complying with pre commencement planning conditions and the agreement of the S106 agreement. Discussions on the funding agreement with Jones Bros are progressing well.


