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# 01 PORTFOLIO DIRECTOR SUMMARY

This quarter was focused on preparing for transferring the Growth Deal and the Portfolio Management Team to the Corporate Joint Committee on 1st of April 2025 alongside a clear focus on Growth Deal delivery.

The Economic Ambition Board approved three business cases. The Full Business Cases for Cydnerth and Parc Bryn Cegin and the Outline Business Case for the Responsible Adventure project. As part of approving the Responsible Adventure Business Case the board set out the requirement for Zip World to address three specific aspects within the next three months, namely - to provide a developed Local Benefits Scheme following engagement with local communities; a strategy and operational principles for its proposed e-bus network; and a progress report on its engagement plan.

The Board also approved a project change request for the Glynllifon project to include a state-of-the-art Rural Economy Hub, sustainable dairy development and Sheep milk Wales. There will also be an agri-tech aspect, linking all three elements in order to deliver high level technical skills and a technology base - which will be available to Agri businesses in the region.

We signed a £4.43m funding agreement which will unlock a total £19m investment in world class training and knowledge transfer facilities across five locations in North Wales. The Tourism Talent Network project, approved by the North Wales Economic Ambition Board last year, will see a network of state-of-the-art facilities become anchors for delivering apprenticeships and other specialist skills support, extensive SME and micro business engagement, as well as a comprehensive programme of school outreach across the region.

The Enterprise Engineering and Optics Centre project is progressing well, with the Plas Coch construction on track for completion in May. A change request was approved for the OpTIC refurbishment. The change was due to higher costs than anticipated at Full Business Case stage, and results in a slight modification in delivery, though there will be no impact on benefits or on the Growth Deal investment. The refurbishment at the Henfaes site for the Centre for Environmental Biotechnology project is continuing to schedule..

Our Shared Prosperity project successfully came to a close at the end of March. The key achievements included the launch of the North Wales Skills Portal, purchase of mobile survey Equipment, grant awards to 16 small and community organisations as well as work on new methodologies, training materials and training to over 100 people on benefits and climate change.

We continue to work closely with Welsh Government and UK Government to increase the pace of delivery on the Growth Deal and work commenced this quarter a Portfolio Review. The next quarter will focus on presenting the recommendations from portfolio review for a decision by the Economic Well-being Sub-Committee.

# 02 PORTFOLIO PERFORMANCE

Portfolio Business Case		The Portfolio Business Case 2024 update was approved by the Economic Ambition Board in October and has been submitted to Welsh Government and UK Government as part of the annual award of funding process. An update will be produced for government following the completion of the portfolio review.
Delivery Pipeline		The delivery pipeline is consistent with the 2024 Portfolio Business Case, with projects reporting against this timetable currently.
Governance		The Portfolio, Programme and Project Management Framework is now well established with the Portfolio Board and five Programme Boards operating effectively. A Conflicts of Interest procedure is in place across all Boards, and is updated annually.
Assurance		The fifth annual Growth Deal assurance review (Programme Assurance Review) was completed in October 2024 and the PMO is working with Welsh Government and UK Government to address the recommendations.
Resource and Capacity		Interim arrangements are currently in place for the Low Carbon Energy Programme Manager with a new permanent member of staff starting in post in April. Budget approval has been secured to extend fixed term staff contracts beyond March 2026 with resourcing requirements currently being reviewed by the Portfolio Director and Head of Operations.
Finance		A total of £15.32m Growth Deal funding has been spent to date. This includes £2.15m on the Digital Signal Processing Centre, £9.81m on the Enterprise Engineering & Optic Centre, £0.58m on the Centre of Environmental Biotechnology, £1m on the Tourism Talent Network and £1.78m to fund the revenue expenditure.
Investment		Securing the public and private sector investment required to deliver the Growth Deal remains a significant risk across the portfolio. The Economic Ambition Board approved the Investment Strategy during their meeting in March 2024.
Risk		Overall risk profile remains consistent with Quarter 3. Procurement of the support services framework (2023 PAR recommendation) is complete. A number of high residual risks remain which are being managed by the PMO including affordability, consenting, delay and investment.
Benefits Monitoring & Evaluation		Training sessions have been held with Ambition North Wales and Project Sponsors in how to use the Benefits Reporting platform.  Projects have all uploaded their indicators, the three projects in delivery have populated the platform enabling the project, programme and portfolio teams to track progress towards spending objectives and benefits.
Emissions and Biodiversity		The streamlined methodology is being finalised and shared. Discussions are underway to consider supporting a small number of Local Authorities as 'Pioneer Councils' to held embed the methodology. Some of our team, along with partners from the region, attended <b>Climate Clarity training</b> . Through Climate Fresk and Biodiversity Collage workshops participants were able to build knowledge, as well a real understanding of challenges and impactful solutions.
Communication and Engagement		We issues a number of press releases including on encouraging feedback on the North Wales Regional Transport public consultation, the launch of the North Wales Skills Portal, welcoming confirmation on the Flintshire and Wrexham Investment Zone by Welsh and UK Governments, successful projects benefitting from Agri-Food Tech Launchpad funding, approval of the Full Business Case for the Cydnerth project, signing of the funding agreement for the Tourism Talent Network project; and we published a case study article during Women in Construction Week.  We worked with Business News Wales on a podcast and accompanying article which focused on the year ahead for the Growth Deal, as well as a podcast and article on the opportunities Al could bring to the private and public sectors in the region.  Our social media channels covered promotion of our press releases with our engagement and reach on social media continued to grow and there were 11k active users of our website (up 33.5%, likely due to the RTP consultation).

#### **RAG Status**

#### **Programme Manager Commentary**

- The **Responsible Adventure** project received approval of the Outline Business Case by the Economic Ambition Board (EAB) on the 14th February 2025. The board request a further report to address three specific concerns before inviting a Full Business Case for the Responsible Adventure project, and invite the company to address these within a 3 month period.
- The **Tourism Talent Network's** Grant Funding Agreement was finalised in late January 2025. The project has entered the delivery phase, with construction progressing well at Portmeirion and Zip World. The first funding claim has been submitted and successfully approved. Grŵp Llandrillo-Menai has identified Theatr Clwyd as the final spoke in the network. Additionally, the first draft of the Business Justification Case was presented to the Portfolio Management Office at the end of March Key agreements have been secured, including a Memorandum of Understanding with Snowdonia Hospitality and Leisure and a back-to-back agreement with Portmeirion.
- The **Glynllifon Rural Economy Hub** presented the change request to the Economic Ambition Board, which was approved on the 14<sup>th</sup> February 2025. The project team is currently drafting two Business Justification Cases, one for each dairy and will update the Full Business Case to reflect the revised scope of the Hub. Planning consent needs to be obtained for the Hub.

A change request, endorsed by the Programme Board, has adjusted the delivery approach for the OpTIC refurbishment due to increased costs. The procurement process for Plas Coch equipment has been completed, leading to the submission of a first draft Business Justification Case for Portfolio Management Office review. Additionally, the relocation of the hydrogen hub now requires obtaining planning consent...
- The **Centre for Environmental Biotechnology** project is progressing well, with the Henfaes refurbishment on schedule for completion by the end of April.

  Procurement for the second phase of equipment has been approved, though not all items were successfully procured. The first funding claim has been submitted for review.


