




Agri-food and Tourism

A project that will expand facilities at Venue Cymru, boost jobs, cut carbon, and attract major shows, conferences, and cultural investment.






Digital Connectivity


Innovation in High Value Manufacturing

The Projects

1. Centre for Environmental Biotechnology

Lead Sponsor: Bangor University

Exploring the use of biological processes as low carbon alternatives to products and industrial manufacturing processes

2. Enterprise Engineering and Optics Centre

Lead Sponsor: Wrexham University

Delivering state-of-the-art facilities to explore optics, photonics and composite materials as a lightweight material alternative, reducing carbon within the sector.

3. Project Prince

Lead Sponsor: Knauf

Delivering a new Rock Mineral Wool insulation manufacturing facility utilising cutting-edge Submerged Arc Furnace melting technology to deliver industry-leading sustainable Rock Mineral Wool production primarily for the UK and Irish markets.

Serving as a bridge between Wrexham University and local industry, fostering collaboration, innovation, job creation and inclusive economic growth.






Land and Property

- Provide up to **20,000m²** in new employment premises
- Deliver up to **1,000** new residential development plots

The Projects

1. Former North Wales Hospital, Denbigh

Lead Sponsor: Jones Bros Civil Engineering UK

Demolish, decontaminate and clean the site so that it's suitable for residential and employment premises in and around the listed former hospital.

2. Parc Bryn Cegin

Lead Sponsor: Ambition North Wales

Funding new build development land for new build low carbon employment premises.

3. Wrexham Gateway

Lead Sponsor: Wrexham County Borough Council

This project forms part of the Wrexham Gateway masterplan which aims to provide a framework of proposals to deliver a transformative mixed-use regeneration of the area.

4. Albert Gubay Business School


Low Carbon Energy

Objectives


- Create up to **1035 jobs**

The Projects

1. Cydnerth (Morlais)

Lead Sponsor: Menter Môn

Connecting Morlais with the electricity grid system, enabling developers of tidal stream technology to deploy their devices in the zone.

2. Low Carbon Energy Centre of Excellence (Egni)

Lead Sponsor: Bangor University

Facilities to enhance the region's capabilities for low carbon energy research and innovation.

3. Clean Energy Fund



Lead Sponsor: Ambition North Wales

Enabling renewable energy and decarbonisation solutions within our local communities.

4. Holyhead Hydrogen Hub

Lead Sponsor: Menter Môn

This project will establish a green hydrogen production and distribution facility, at Parc Cybi, Holyhead within the Anglesey Freeport zone, supplying road, maritime and rail transport customers across North Wales.
